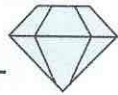

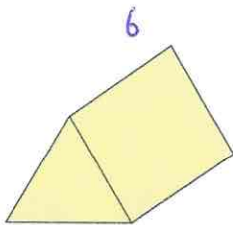

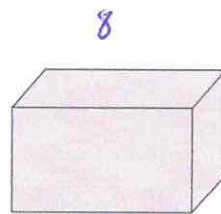
Donna has 60p

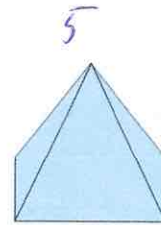
